Why Automotive Service?

Automotive service technicians have a working knowledge of the complex systems and interconnected devices that are the mark of a modern vehicle, and are skilled in the use of the advanced technology necessary to keep those vehicles on the road.

Automotive service technicians enjoy careers that are dynamic, rewarding and secure. When a vehicle breaks down, after all, outsourcing the repair work is not an option.

What is GM ASEP?

The General Motors ASEP is a two-year associate degree program that combines advanced automotive technical training with a strong academic foundation in reading, electronics and analytical skills.

You will alternate in 8- and 12-week intervals between Macomb and a paid position at a GM dealership, where you will be assigned to work with an experienced service technician. Scholarships and tuition assistance are available for your Macomb coursework.

After successful completion of the GM ASEP, you will likely be retained as a full-time automotive service technician at your sponsoring dealership.

Your Training at Macomb

The technical part of your GM ASEP training at Macomb will be provided through the college's Automotive Technology Program, certified by the National Institute for Automotive Service Excellence.

In a state-of-the-art facility on Macomb's South Campus, you will learn by working on late model GM vehicles in modern service bays, using the most up-to-date diagnostic and repair tools available. The required academic courses for your associate degree may be taken at either South or Center Campus.

With an associate degree in automotive technology, you will be qualified for careers including mechanic or automotive service technician. Median salary for these careers is \$38,630 in Michigan with 6 percent growth in openings expected through 2026. You may also be qualified for careers including emissions engineer or test engineer. Median salary for these careers is \$53,470 in Michigan with 10 percent growth in openings expected through 2026.
